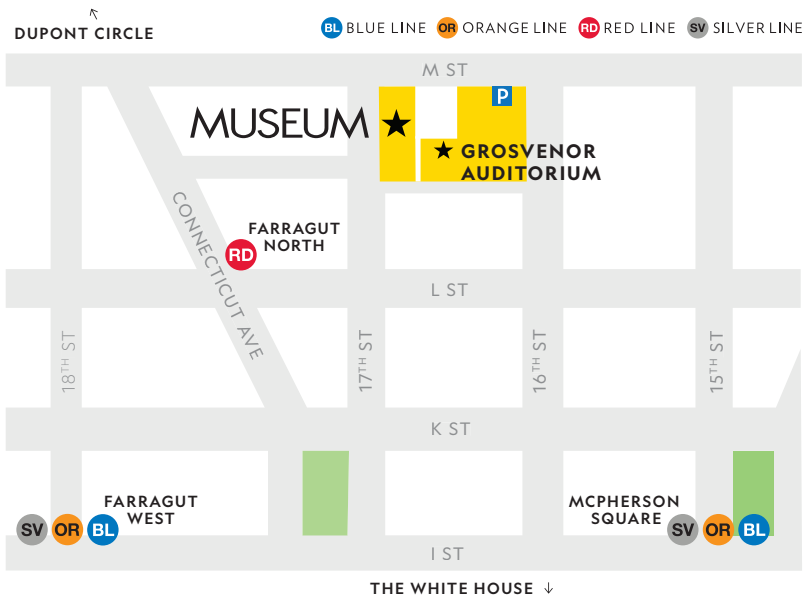
WHAT TO EXPECT
